A person may be considered a dislocated worker if he or she:

_____ has been terminated, laid off, or received a notice of termination or layoff and are unlikely to return to a previous occupation or industry because of:

- A permanent plant closure
- A substantial layoff
- Foreign competition
- Lack of demand for your skills

_____ was self-employed but now unemployed due to economic conditions or natural disaster; i.e. farmers, ranchers, fisherman etc.

_____ is eligible for or has exhausted unemployment compensation

_____ is a displaced homemaker who is a person who previously provided unpaid services to the family (e.g. a stay-at-home mom or dad) and is no longer supported by another family member, is unemployed or underemployed, and is having trouble finding or upgrading employment.

NOTE: If a person quits work, he or she is NOT considered a dislocated worker even if that person receives unemployment benefits.
