Defining Proactive and Reactive Safety Approaches

- **Proactive Safety:** This approach focuses on **identifying and mitigating potential Hazards** before they lead to incidents. While it's important to learn from past incidents, relying solely on this approach can lead to repeated mistakes and unsafe conditions.
